#### Domenico Cimarosa (1749 – 1801)

Domenico Cimarosa was an Italian composer of the Neapolitan School and of the Classical period. He wrote more than eighty operas, the best known of which is *Il Matrimonio Segreto* (1792) It is said only Mozart's Le nozze di Figaro (1786) was more popular: in the 19th century the French writer Stendhal claimed he'd rather be hanged than to say whether he preferred the music of Mozart or Cimarosa. Most of Cimarosa's operas are comedies. He also wrote instrumental works and church music.

Cimarosa wrote a large number of piano sonatas, which were only discovered in the 1920s. It is estimated there are over 80 single-movement works, but it is thought that many of these may in fact belong with each other as three-movement works.

I have titled the sonatas with the original key, although these are always the same as those in my arrangements.

It comprises four sonatas: Allegro Brioso, Largo and Allegro (grouped as #78), Andante con Moto (#79), Allegro Con Brio (#80)







It was Julian Bream who brought the attention of guitarists to these sonatas, with his publication in 1968 of his arrangements of three of them.
